Visa Requirements/Residence Permit Application

Entry Regulations	Applicants from EU/EFTA nations as well as some other nations do not need a visa to study in Germany.
	All applicants from Non-EU nations need a visa to study in Germany. In order to get a visa, you must apply for one at the embassy or consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in your home country. You must apply for your visa at least 2 months ahead of time. Please do not travel to Germany on a tourist visa, since it cannot be changed to a student visa. Students that are in Germany on a tourist visa are not entitled to study there. Students from Switzerland who are allowed to enter Germany without a visa have to fill out a residence permit application, which can be obtained at the local Foreigner's Registration Authority.

	Certification (former E111 or E128) or EHIC-Card from their insurer in their home
	country and present it to a German national insurer to receive the demanded proof.
	Students originating from countries outside the EU must also present a certificate
	entitling them to German health insurance coverage. Students who are not insured in
	their home countries, obtain German insurance through a German national health
	insurer of their choice. Full coverage for students is around € 76-78 monthly.


