COURSES

CEU offers more than 800 courses. Erasmus+ students must complete at least 50% of their courses (or ECTS credits) within their host department. The remaining credits may be taken from other departments, provided the courses are relevant to the student's current studies.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Erasmus+ students study alongside degree-seeking students who have already demonstrated strong English skills. For this reason, Erasmus+ applicants are expected to have a comparable level of proficiency (B2–C1 on the CEFR scale).

GRADES

CEU evaluates student work using letter grades and grade points. The lowest passing grade is C+. At the end of each course, instructors provide a detailed breakdown of grade components. Transcripts also include GPA equivalents.

A = Excellent (3.67+ GPA)
B = Good (3.33 GPA)
C+ = Minimum Passing Grade (2.33 GPA)
F = Fail (0 GPA)

INSURANCE & HEALTH

EU/EEA students must bring a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Non-EU/EEA students are required to obtain Austrian health insurance that is accepted by the local immigration authority (MA35). CEU provides advice on suitable insurance options.

VISA & RESIDENCE PERMIT

EU/EEA students do not need a visa, but are required to register their residence in Vienna. Non-EU/EEA students staying longer than 90 days must apply for either a Visa D (for short-term stays) or a Residence Permit – Student (for long-term stays). CEU's Student Life Office offers support with visa and residence procedures.
