Nomination	Erasmus+ and exchange students should be nominated by their respective home university. Each nomination must contain: ○ Full name ○ Gender ○ Date of birth ○ Email address ○ Cycle of the mobility (Bachelor, Master, Doctorate) ○ Period of stay
Nomination deadline	15 April for students starting in winter semester 15 October for students starting in summer semester
Application process	After nomination, applicants are expected to complete the Application Form as well as the Online Learning Agreement (OLA) and submitting along with their application the following scans: ○ Copy of passport/ID ○ One passport size picture ○ German or English language proficiency certificate ○ Health insurance card or private insurance policy
Application deadline	15 May for students starting in winter semester 15 November for students starting in summer semester
Language requirements	Our standard entry requirement is B2 level in German language, with the following exceptions: ➤ Master Mining Engineering ➤ Master Computer Science ➤ Master Intelligent Manufacturing ➤ Master Chemistry ➤ Master Petroleum Engineering These programs are entirely taught in English. Students wishing to enroll only in courses taught in English will not need to provide any German language certificate.

Online Course Catalogue	You may find the current Course Catalogue HERE When selecting courses, students must pay attention to the method of assessment. Most of the courses are assessed continuously throughout the semester in which the course is offered. Students must be aware that attendance to the lectures and laboratories is a relevant part of the assessment, and is thus an important factor to think about when choosing modules.
International Management Business Semester (IBMS)	During winter semesters from October to March, we offer in addition an International Business Management Semester (IBMS). All these courses are taught in English so that students can participate without any knowledge of German. Knowledge of English (at least B2) is required. This program will include courses in Intercultural Competence and language training.

Required course load	Depends on home institution. In general, international students are expected to take the usual academic load of 30 credits per semester.
Tuition and other fees	Erasmus+/Exchange students are not subject to tuition fees, but will be subject to an administrative fee. The administrative fee for each semester currently amounts to 167 €. Those courses take place twice a week for about 2 hours each. 2) Preparatory intensive German Language Courses prior to each semester. Please note that a fee is due for the Intensive German Language Courses. Course restrictions	There aren't any course restrictions. Exchange students should, however, mainly chose modules within their field of study stated in the bilateral exchange agreement signed between partner university and TUC. Some classes have restrictions in terms of number of participants.

MEDICAL INSURANCE	
Overview	Erasmus+/Exchange students are required to obtain medical insurance according to German standards (starting with about 100 €/month). Travel insurances are not accepted. Exemption is possible, if the medical insurance from the home country does comply with German standards. For more information please check HERE .
Additional types of insurance	We strongly recommend that international students take out a liability insurance policy. Liability insurance protects the policy holder against third party claims within the context of a previously arranged coverage. Under this insurance, payment is not typically made to the insured party, but rather to the person who suffered loss, damage or pain and is not a part of the insurance policy. In general, damage caused intentionally and contractual liabilities are not covered under liability insurance policies. This insurance covers typical everyday risks (e.g. the damage caused by a bike hitting a car). In particular, liability for owning or renting a house or apartment as well as for athletic activities is to a limited extent covered by this insurance. Usually, students can arrange liability insurance in their home country. Be sure, however, that the particular liability insurance policy is also valid in foreign countries, especially in Germany.

SAMPLE BUDGET FOR A MONTH	
Housing	Monthly rent between 360 – 586 € including utilities. Please also check the additional Starter Packages of the Students' Dormitory residents might be interested in HERE .
Meals	Meals at the students' canteen start at 3 €
Personal expenses	Students requiring a visa currently need to prove of 992 € per month. For living in Clausthal-Zellerfeld, though, students should plan on having 900 € per month in total.
