As per the new Sapienza guidelines, students are no longer required to provide an official certificate attesting their Italian language level, however, we recommend that students have no less than an **intermediate level of Italian** to make the most of their stay and make daily life in Rome easier and more enjoyable.

An **intermediate level of English** is accepted instead of Italian proficiency in the following cases:

- students who wish to attend classes from degree programs fully or partially taught in English (<http://corsidilaurea.uniroma1.it/en>)
- students coming for their final thesis project or for training work, whose tutor accepts English as working language.

Sapienza University organizes both extensive and intensive language courses before the beginning of each semester, upon arrival.

Italian language courses are free of charge. In order to enroll in Sapienza Italian language courses, incoming Erasmus students must fill out the relevant section on their Application Form.
